The service is for the homeless, vulnerably housed, people with addictions, ex-prisoners and others with various complex needs.

The overall aim is to create a culture of recovery.

Saturday provision 9.30am - 12pm pre-booked for up to twelve visitors during the previous week on a first-come-first-served basis.

Catholic Leamington works in partnership with the Salvation Army on the Way Ahead Project (WAP). The Saturday Friendship Group provides volunteers and finance particularly for Saturday. Volunteers also assist WAP during the week.

The Way Ahead Project offers friendship, support, access to simple food, showers and toilets, clothes washing, distribution of Big Issue, food and clothes vouchers, access to computers, accompaniment to appointments as well as other advice and advocacy, and access to rehabilitation. 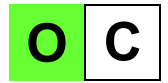

Family Information Service (FIS)

FIS is a signposting service for families and professionals working with families in Warwickshire.

FIS brokerage service offers 1:1 support in people's homes where there are barriers to them accessing services. Typical barriers include mental health, disabilities and English as an additional language. Brokerage is an early help practical support service.

FIS can also provide information on childcare, special education needs and disabilities, family finances, parenting support including support with bullying.

Financial support offered will typically be unpicking the needs of the family, contacting providers/services on behalf of the family, organising payment plans, supporting the family with budgeting, applying for funding where appropriate.

The services can be accessed by families with children and young people aged 0-25 years.

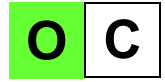
This service is for people who are trying to stop a forced marriage or are trying to leave a marriage they've been forced into.

Helping Hands Community Project

Helping Hands support families and individuals (including ex-offenders) struggling with issues such as homelessness or domestic violence. They also offer support to anyone affected by mental health issues such as depression/anxiety. We run various projects in the daytime and in the evenings:-

Day time Drop in times:-

Mon 1pm-3pm-lunch,

Tues morning breakfast 10am-12pm,

Tuesday pm (women only) Activities/food - 12.30pm-3pm.

Thursday (Men only) Activities/food - 1pm-3pm

Evening Drop in times:-

Thursday 6.30pm - 8pm

(Day-time and evening drop in sessions may be extended when possible during winter months)

Street Outreach also happens during evening soup kitchen hours - A team go out onto the streets of Leamington to give out food and drinks and support those who don't attend the drop-in and for anyone rough sleeping.

Drop-in Support includes:-

Food, food vouchers, sleeping bags, clothes, shoes, toiletries, rucksacks, referrals for addiction support/housing support/counselling. Appointments can also be made with Helping Hands support workers to help with any additional needs.

House2Home project :-

Furniture, household goods (kitchen, bathroom or bedroom packs), toiletries, clothes, children's toys/baby equipment are given to low income families and individuals, victims of domestic violence moving into area with no personal belongings, those moving into a new property after being homeless.

Referrals can also be offered to further support with other relevant local services e.g. debt advice/food vouchers/ children's services.

The service is for adults from deprived backgrounds, suffering from social exclusion, poverty, poor health, social isolation or who are otherwise marginalised.

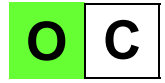
Pathway runs on an ad-hoc basis, with weekly mentoring sessions.
